## National Children's Ministry Curriculum First Quarter: September - November 2023

**Follow Me** is the theme chosen for this church year for our children. This theme is based in God's call to humanity to follow His ways and be like Him (1 Peter 1:16). It is both a call to salvation for the unsaved and a call to discipleship for the saved. By extension, it is a call by Jamaican children to recognise they can be examples of true Christianity despite their age (1 Corinthians 11:1; 1 Timothy 4:12) and to call others to follow Jesus, just as Philip called Nathaniel (John 1:43-46).

The National Youth Department's Godstyle Lifestyle theme has a special focus on Evangelism this year. Throughout the Follow Me programme, we're exploring four subthemes which will take the children on a journey through the big story of the Bible. This journey unpacks the stories and some themes of the Bible. We want the children to understand first, that <u>God Keeps His Promises</u>, then to recognise that <u>God Delivers</u> His followers, <u>We Choose</u> to follow Him and we are invited to Call Others to Follow Him.

We have added a new column this year. It seeks to challenge our children to do something special to show their commitment to following Jesus. The 'Fallafashin' Challenge invites our children to do something each Quarter, whether it's learning a Scripture, hymn or inviting someone with them to Church. We hope that through this challenge children will accept the call from Jesus to **Follow Me**.

Week 4	Follower Promises	At the end of this session the children will be able to:-  -Explain that God's promises are often on the condition of obedience  -Explain it is important for God's followers to ALSO keep their promises  -Recognise as Christians, we do not swear oaths such as 'God see and know' or 'God believe me' or 'I swear it's true'  -Explain why as Christians, we do not deceive others then say 'I was only joking'  ***  -Acknowledge and explain the promise of eternal life given to those who follow Jesus  - Tell why they can trust the promise of heaven that God	Drama Activities Let one group of the children produce a dramatization in which someone is not believed because they often don't keep their promises (a modern production of the Boy who cried wolf).
